## 2. Review of Recent Events

Cake Sale (16/01/20 \& 27/02/20)
Cake sales continue to raise much needed funds for the school council to determine where they are best spent. Mr Jackson's cake sale (16/01/20) raised $£ 61.65$ with Mrs Manfredi's cake sale (27/02/20) to be counted. There was some confusion on the last cake sale regarding who could buy cakes. It was clarified that whichever class provides cakes; their respective key stage classes will be able to purchase cakes.

## Quiz Night (07/02/20) - Wendy Baynes

The quiz night, organised by Wendy Baynes, never disappoints with lots of laughter on the night with highlights including a "hot dog or legs" round and the challenge of making a Lionel Richie head out of Playdoh! Last year's winners, No Hope Here, did a fabulous job of running the quiz with thanks to Tina and Dave for providing delicious food on the night. Congratulations to "Wilf's Wizards" who, as this year's winners, return once more to run the quiz next year. Thank you also to the teachers for setting up the hall. The hall was full in spite of numbers slightly down this year and the event raised $£ 330.45$. Consideration will be given to permitting teams of 6 , increasing the ticket price to $£ 7$ (to allow for food costs) and having a raffle on the night.

## 3. Review of Previous Minutes

VE Day (Ruth Wood / Danielle Still / Joanne Hyslop / Abby Bull)
In commemoration of the 75th anniversary of VE Day, an after school community / fundraising event will be held with live music, dance demonstrations, children performances, refreshments, bar and raffle.
Abby confirmed that unfortunately an official Guinness World Record attempt is not viable as, with any group attempt, it has to be prioritised with costs of upwards of $£ 350$.
A poster has been drafted to advertise the event which will be sent out shortly. Raffle prizes have been sourced including beauty bundle, restaurant vouchers, family days out etc. There will be a sweet stall with sweets in red, white and blue candy striped paper bags with a request for sweet donations to be issued prior to Easter break.
There will be collection buckets on the day for The Royal British Legion in recognition of their service. Following discussion on food alternatives (e.g. pizza van), all agreed that families could bring their own picnic instead with hot dogs available for purchase if required.
At the previous meeting, Alice suggested that we invite veterans to the event with an offer of a free hot drink and cake to come and enjoy the performances.

## Casino Night (Anne-Marie Marshall)

Vale Abbey Hall has been booked for 20/06/20 to hold our inaugural casino night with tables, croupiers and props provided by partycasinos.co.uk. There will also be a 3 course meal and disco included in the price of the tickets. Professional photographs will be taken at no extra cost.
Anne-Marie and Louise Comley provided a breakdown of actions and confirmed a sub-committee has been established to organise the event. Some customer feedback has been solicited at the school gates from primarily Year 1 and Year 3 Mum's to ascertain whether ticket pricing is appropriate and general feedback on the event. Feedback very positive and ticket interest high.
No concerns were raised regarding the selling of tickets however the price of tickets and overall expenditure was discussed at length to ensure that, where possible, the uniqueness of the event doesn't inadvertently price some families out. Minimum expenditure was confirmed as the initial ticket price of $£ 45$ per person. It was also noted that all other events on the FODS calendar either do not require an entrance fee or it is minimal with the circus ( $£ 10$ per person) the most expensive to date. As such, there have been a variety of events provided to suit all budgets and tastes throughout the academic year. Attire was also discussed with all in agreement on formal attire as it was felt most would have a suit / evening dress already rather than mandate a dress code.
All money raised on the tables goes to FODS with prizes to be sourced for winners. Various companies were discussed to approach (including sponsorship) who would tie in with the Bond theme (e.g. Bentley, Cocktail experiences etc.) as well as approaching local builders who could offer a cash prize. Sophie Killey confirmed that she and other Barclays colleagues would be able to apply for matched funding up to $£ 1000$ each. Applications will need to state what the individual has specifically helped with and the overall amount proportionately split by the team directly involved in that activity. A phased communication approach was highlighted with weekly communications to drum up interest with tickets targeted for sale at Parents Evening ( $50 \%$ deposit required only). Target is to sell 150 tickets with the funds raised used to continue improvement of the outdoor area to create a wellbeing area for all children to enjoy.
